Week 1

## BELIEVING WITH GOD

### **Day 1: Believing God is First in All Things**

**What has to change in order to put God first in every area of your life?**

The beginning of anything sets the direction for what follows. As we start these 21 days of prayer and fasting, we begin by choosing to put God first in every area of our lives. Matthew 6:33 says to, “seek first the kingdom of God”, trusting that when He is first, everything else finds its proper place.

Day One is an invitation to examine our hearts and remove anything that has competed with God for first place—sins, distractions, fears, habits, priorities, or even good things that have taken His rightful position. Putting God first is not about trying to be perfect, it’s about surrender. Surrender is a daily decision to center our lives on Him and to trust that He alone is worthy of our devotion.

Ask God to realign your heart, renew your hunger for His presence, and establish Him as first place in your time, your thoughts, your decisions, and your future. When God is first, your faith gets stronger, things make sense, and you make room for God’s power to be released in every area of your life.

#### **Prayer**

*Father, today I choose to put You first in all things. I surrender every area of my life to You and lay down anything that has taken Your place. Forgive me of any sin in my life and remove every obstacle that has distracted my heart or divided my devotion. Align my priorities with Your will and deepen my desire for Your presence. As I begin these 21 days of prayer, I declare that You are FIRST in my life—now and always. In Jesus name, amen.*

# Day Two

## BELIEVING WITH GOD

### **Day 2: Believe with BIG Gratitude**

**How can I show more gratitude this year?**

When we can focus on being thankful, it changes perspective and posture. Gratitude is not just a feeling we express when things are going well; it is a decision that aligns our hearts with truth. When life feels uncertain or overwhelming, gratitude becomes an act of faith—choosing to acknowledge God’s goodness before circumstances change. It anchors us in what is eternal rather than what is temporary.

Gratitude teaches us to recognize God as our source. It reminds us that every breath, every opportunity, and every provision comes from Him. When we practice gratitude, we loosen our grip on control and shift from striving to trusting. It recalibrates our perspective, quiets our complaints, and positions our hearts to receive what God is doing now—not just what we hope He will do next.

As you pray today, let gratitude become a posture of surrender. Thank God not only for answered prayers, but for His presence in the waiting. In gratitude, we declare that God is enough, and that He is faithful in every season.

#### **Prayer**

*Lord, I choose gratitude as an act of faith. Even when I don't understand everything, I trust that You are good and that You are with me. Align my heart with truth and help me to see my life through the lens of Your faithfulness. Let gratitude shape my attitude, strengthen my trust, and keep my focus on You. I surrender every season to You with a thankful heart. In Jesus name, amen..*

# Day Three

## BELIEVING WITH GOD

### **Day 3: Believe Big for Your Life**

**What do you want to see God accomplish in your life this year?**

God wants to help you answer this question. As this new year begins, it's time to exercise your faith! Matthew 7:7 says, "ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." So, what are you believing God for this year? Believe BIG! God is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all we can ask or think (Ephesians 3:20)

Today, lift your expectations and align your heart with God's promises. Take a moment to release the past year, limitations, disappointments, and small thinking, and trust that God's plans for your life are good, purposeful, and filled with hope. As you pray today, ask God to expand your vision, strengthen your faith, and help you believe not just for what feels possible—but for what only He can do.

Let this be the foundation of the next 21 days: Bold faith, surrendered hearts, and confident trust in a faithful God who still moves mountains!

#### **Prayer**

*Father God, as I step into this new year, I choose to trust You with my whole heart. Expand my faith and help me to believe bigger than my past, my fears, and my limitations. I surrender my plans to You and ask that You align my desires with Your will. Do exceedingly and abundantly more in my life than I could ask or imagine. I place my hope in You and declare that this year is in Your hands, in Jesus name.*

# Day Four

## BELIEVING WITH GOD

### Day 4: Believe Big for Your Family

#### What Do You Want God to Establish in Your Family?

No matter what happens in the world, we can choose the type of home we are going to have. We may not be able to control what happens around us, but we can decide to say, “as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD” (Joshua 24:15). Today, lift your family before God with bold faith - believing for peace and provision.

As you pray today, declare what God wants to establish in your family this year. Maybe it's stronger relationships, healed hearts, deeper faith, or a commitment to come together and pray together. Believe that God is at work in every person in your family, every generation represented, praying God's will over their lives.

#### **Prayer**

*Jesus, I place my family in Your hands today. I believe You are establishing our home in Your love, Your peace, and Your truth. Heal what is broken, strengthen what is weak, and draw our hearts closer to You and to one another. I declare that my family will serve You, walk in unity, and grow in faith this year. Have Your way in our home, Lord. In your name.*

# Day Five

## BELIEVING WITH GOD

### Day 5: Believe Big for Our Church

What do you want to see God do in our church this year?

The Church is God's idea, and when His people come together in faith and unity, He can't help but move in His power. God has done so many amazing things in our church, but He has so much more ahead for our house. Today, we believe God BIG for Jubilee Church—trusting Him to establish our church as a place of faith and freedom, restoration, and a place where God's presence dwells. Jubilee is not just a building; we are a body of believers called to reflect God's glory and His truth to our community, our nation and the world.

As we pray today, we ask God to deepen our hunger for His presence, strengthen our unity, and expand our impact. We believe for more people who are willing to serve others and make disciples. We are believing for salvations, discipleship, and renewed passion for God's mission. This year, we trust that God will do more than we can see—building His church, advancing His kingdom, and using Jubilee Church to bring hope and healing to many.

#### Prayer

*Jesus, we lift up our Church to You today. We believe You are establishing our church as a dwelling place for Your presence, Your power, and Your purpose. Unite us as one body, fill us with fresh faith, and use us to reach the lost, disciple the faithful, and serve our community with love. Let Jubilee Church be a place where lives are transformed and Your name is glorified. We trust You to do exceedingly and abundantly more in this church than we could ask or imagine. In Jesus name, Amen.*

# Day Six

## BELIEVING WITH GOD

### **Day 6: Believe Big for Salvation**

**Who is one person you are believing to give their life to Christ this year?**

Do you have someone in your life who is far from God? Maybe it's your spouse, a child, a parent or sibling. Maybe it's a friend or coworker. Whoever it is, there is a reason they are on your heart. Jesus told us to pray for the lost, Matthew 9, for the harvest is plentiful. In 1st Timothy 2, Paul reminds us to pray for all people and that it is God's desire for all people to be saved. If Paul wasn't too far gone for God to save, neither is the person on your heart. Today, unapologetically ask God to save that person! And if there is a tangible way for you to reach out and encourage them, do it.

Salvation is the greatest miracle, and today we choose to believe BIG for souls to be saved. We lift up family members, friends, neighbors, and our community—trusting that the Holy Spirit is drawing hearts to Jesus and opening eyes to His truth. Remember that no one is beyond God's reach. We believe for softened hearts, divine encounters, and bold obedience to share the hope we carry.

#### **Prayer**

*Father God, we come before You believing big for salvation. We lift up those who do not know You and ask that You draw them by Your love. Open hearts, remove blinders, and create divine moments where people encounter Your truth and grace. Use my life as a vessel of hope to invite people into a real relationship with you, to be Lord and Savior of their lives. We trust You for souls to be saved and lives to be changed. In Jesus name, amen.*

# Day Seven

## BELIEVING WITH GOD

### **Day 7: Believe Even Bigger**

#### **Do You Really Believe God Can Do It?**

If we're honest, one of the reasons we don't pray as much as we should is because sometimes we don't believe God is going to answer our prayers.

When we first come to know Christ, we believe God can do anything. But along the way, it can be easy to lose that faith. If you've been let down or experienced some tough times, it can be difficult to still believe with God.

But that's what we're called to do!

What if 2026 was the year you got your hopes up again? What if this was the year you started believing that God can actually heal, move, and change lives? And most importantly, what if we started fasting and praying like that was actually true?

In Ephesians 3, Paul prays for his friends, then watch how he ends the prayer: "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us" (Ephesians 3:20).

Paul went through a lot of trials and a ton of hardships. However, along the way, he never stopped believing that God could do immeasurably more than he could even imagine. Get your hopes up for what God can do during these 21 days and what He has planned for this entire year.

#### **Prayer**

*Father, would you increase my faith? I want to believe that you really can do immeasurably more than anything I could think or imagine. I want to believe that you are big enough. Would you show me just how loving you are this year, in Jesus name. Amen.*

# Day Eight

Week 2

TEACH US HOW TO PRAY

## Day 8: Make it Personal

“Our Father in Heaven...”

Prayer is not transactional. Prayer is relational. Prayer is communion with God, it's an opportunity for a two-way conversation with the Creator of the universe, your Heavenly Father, the friend that sticks closer than a brother.

The goal of prayer is “God” – It's not to get something from God, it's to get more of Him. A relationship isn't something you do alone, it's two people. Prayer is your chance to get to know God as your Father.

### Prayer

*Father, thank you. Thank you for my life. Thank you for all the things you are doing in and through me this year. Thank you for my family and friends and all the people you put in my life to keep me going. Your mercies are made new every morning, so today, I thank you that I have a fresh start, a second chance. Would you show me just how much I have to be thankful for today, in Jesus' name. Amen.*

# Day Nine

## TEACH US HOW TO PRAY

### Day 9: Lead with Praise

“Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name...”

When you hallow His name, you are praising Him. You are giving him thanks and all the glory to put Him in his rightful place. Praise Him for all He is and all He's done. Rather than coming in desperate, praying for your needs first. Don't start your prayer with a task list, start your prayer with praise and thanksgiving.

Psalm 100:4 says, “Enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise”

Praise doesn't replace prayer, it sets your heart and aligns your spirit into a place of honor and relationship with Jesus.

#### **Prayer**

*Father I enter Your gates with thanksgiving and come into Your courts with praise today. I'm thankful that you saved me and healed me and have given me access to Your presence. I'm grateful that I can worship you and have relationship with you. Holy Spirit help me to set my heart and affection on the Lord alone and to trust Him in all things and not try to live in my own strength. Help me to honor the Lord in everything I do. In Jesus Name. Amen.*

# Day Ten

## TEACH US HOW TO PRAY

### Day 10: Align With His Plans

“Your Kingdom come, Your Will be done on earth as it is in heaven...”

The next part of the prayer is surrender. Jesus prays, “your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven” (Matthew 6:10).

Do you believe that God has a plan and a purpose for your life? Do you believe that his plan is better than anything you could ever dream up?

The easy answer to those questions is yes. But if we are being honest, truly believing this can be challenging, especially when you are going through a difficult season. God’s way doesn’t always make sense to us. He even tells us in his Word: “For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways,” declares the Lord. “As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts” (Isaiah 55:8-9).

Our job is not to try to figure God out; it’s to trust that he really is our loving Father who wants what is best for us.

#### **Prayer**

*Father, I trust you. Thank you for being a loving God who wants what is best for me. It doesn’t always make sense to me, but I know your ways are higher than mine, and you know what is best for me. And so, I surrender today to you. I’m ready for you to lead, because I know you will get me where I need to go. Thank you for being a good God in Jesus’ name. Amen.*

# Day Eleven

## TEACH US HOW TO PRAY

### Day 11: Ask For What You Need

“Give us this day our daily bread...”

The next line Jesus prays is, “Give us today our daily bread” (Matthew 6:11).

It’s time to ask God for the things we need. First off, notice that Jesus prays for his daily bread. How often do we need to pray for daily bread? That’s not a trick question. The answer is every day. Some of us would love to be able to pray for our weekly bread or monthly bread and cover our bases, but that’s not how prayer works. Prayer is an invitation to talk to God daily.

God knows what we need before we ask, but did you know he loves it when we talk to him about the things we need? Every good parent understands this principle. You know what your kids need, but there is something amazing about the moment they stop and ask for it.

What is the daily bread you need from God today?

Do you need a door to open up at work?

Do you need a promotion?

Do you need patience for someone in your life? Do you need a relationship mended?

There is nothing too big or too small to ask God for today, so ask him!

#### **Prayer**

*Father, thank you for being a good God who promises to provide. You know what I need, but you love when I ask, so today, I pray that you would give me favor at work. Would you continue to open the right doors for me to walk through? Lord, I ask for some good quality time to spend with my family or friends. And I pray that you would keep me and everyone in my family healthy, in Jesus’ name.  
Amen.*

# Day Twelve

## TEACH US HOW TO PRAY

### Day 12: Repent and Forgive

“Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors...”

Jesus prayed, Matthew 6:12 says, “Forgive us our debt”.

The first part of this is repentance. To repent means to turn. To turn and go the opposite direction. This invitation is all throughout Scripture, Jesus already paid the price for all our sins. 2 Corinthians 5:21 says, “God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.”

Jesus went to the cross to pay the price for our sins, so we don't have to be afraid to talk to God about our failures and mistakes. Instead, Hebrews 4:16 says, “Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need”.

What do you need to confess? What do you need to repent of?

Repentance is just the first half of the equation. Jesus goes on to say, “Forgive us our debt as we also have forgiven our debtors” Matthew 6:12.

Asking God to forgive us is the easy part; turning around and offering that same forgiveness to other people is the tough part, especially when someone really hurts or offends us.

Who is one person you need to forgive today? Take a moment to pray for that person. Pray that God would bless them and provide for them. Spend today's prayer time talking to God about these areas of your life. Confess it, turn from it, and take some tangible steps to make sure you don't go back to it.

#### **Prayer**

*Father, thank you for being such a patient God. I know I fall short all the time, but I thank you that you aren't done with me yet. Today, I want to repent. I confess my sin and my failures, I turn back to you. I know forgiveness isn't easy. I pray that you would remind me of the great lengths you went to and the things you went through to offer me forgiveness. Would that truth empower me to turn around and forgive this person in my life, in Jesus' name. amen.*

# Day Thirteen

## TEACH US HOW TO PRAY

### **Day 13: Pray With Authority**

**“And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.”**

We all need God to protect us. It doesn't matter how long you have been a Christian or how strong you think your faith may be; if Jesus had to pray for protection, we need to do the same.

Perhaps the most powerful story of fasting in Scripture is when Jesus went out into the wilderness and abstained from food and water for forty days. At the end of the forty days, Satan met him in the wilderness to tempt him.

It's easy to read that and think how scary it must've been for Jesus to be tempted while he was so weak, but the opposite is actually true. After forty days of fasting, Jesus was physically weak, but he was spiritually strong. Although it may not feel like it at the moment, fasting increases our ability to fight off temptation and be the men and women God wants us to be.

As you may have noticed, Jesus' ministry began right after he got back from the wilderness. This is a very common pattern. As we approach our third and final week of fasting, be encouraged that God may have called you to do this fast because he has a big next step coming for you.

That should excite you, but it should also give you all the more reason to pray that God would protect you in the process. Spend a couple of minutes calling out the things that tempt you by name. Get specific. Is it greed? Lust? Power? Fame? Don't be embarrassed. God knows you better than you know yourself. Call it out and then ask God to protect you by praying this prayer:

#### **Prayer**

**Father, I feel good right now, but you know how quickly that can turn. As I go throughout my day, I pray that you would lead me down a path of righteousness. I know the enemy is trying to take me down. So, Lord, protect me from any temptations that may come my way and deliver me from the evil one, in Jesus' name. Amen.**

# Day Fourteen

## TEACH US HOW TO PRAY

### **Day 14: Pray with Power**

**Put on the full armor of God and pray in the Spirit**

Prayer is not passive—it is powerful. God’s Word reminds us that our battle is not against flesh and blood, but against spiritual powers, and God has not left us unprotected or unprepared. When we put on the whole armor of God, we are equipped to stand firm, resist the enemy, and pray with confidence and authority.

Read Ephesians 6:10-18

Truth guards our hearts, righteousness steadies our steps, peace anchors our footing, faith extinguishes the enemy’s lies, salvation protects our minds, and the Word of God becomes our sword in the spirit. But the armor is activated through prayer—especially as we pray in the Spirit. Praying in the Spirit aligns us with God’s will, strengthens us from the inside out, and releases power beyond our own understanding.

You can’t always trust your mind to pray, because your mind is biased and too influenced by your circumstances. So, it’s time for you to start praying in the spirit!

Romans 8:26 says, “Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.

The Holy Spirit is here to help you pray!

#### **Prayer**

*Father God, Today I put on the full armor of God. I clothe myself in truth, righteousness, peace, faith, salvation, and Your Word. I choose to pray in the Spirit, trusting You to guide my prayers and strengthen my heart. Empower me to stand firm, resist the enemy, and pray with boldness and authority. I declare that my prayers are effective and that I walk in the victory You have already won. In Jesus’ name, amen.*

# Day Fifteen

## PRAYING FOR COMMUNITY

### Day 15: Pray for Your Community

Today, we begin to pray for our community, our city and our neighborhoods. Our community is made up of people, and we are called to love others and show the love of Jesus to people around us. Jesus came because of His love for people, so let's pray for those who don't know Jesus, claim their souls for Him.

God has placed us where we are for a purpose. Our neighborhoods, schools, workplaces, and relationships matter deeply to Him. When we pray for our community, we partner with God to bring hope, healing, and light right where we live. Prayer shifts atmospheres and opens doors for God's love to be seen and felt.

Pray for the broken-hearted. Pray for children who have been abandoned, abused or neglected. Pray for those struggling with addictions. Pray for healing in people's hearts and relationships, Pray for prosperity and blessings over the all people in your community! Don't just pray, but find a way to serve someone in your community today. We pray for the love of Jesus to be evident in our community and that we would show the love of Jesus to others.

#### **Prayer**

*Lord, I lift up my community to You. Bring unity, peace, and restoration where there is brokenness. Help me to be a light and a reflection of Your love to those around me. Let Your presence be known in every home, school, and gathering place. In Jesus' name, amen.*

# Day Sixteen

## PRAYING FOR COMMUNITY

---

### Day 16: Pray for Your City

Cities shape culture, influence generations, and carry both great promise and great need. God cares about the spiritual and practical well-being of our cities.

2 Chronicles 7:14 is clear about what we need to do to see change and revival in our city. First, we have to humble ourselves by simply submitting to God and acknowledging that He is God and we are not. Second, we are to pray and seek His face, not His hand, we should be locked in on God's purposes with continual, fervent prayer. Third, we have to turn from our wicked ways. God wants our repentance and our obedience. When we do these three things, God promises to respond in three ways, He will hear our prayers, forgive our sins and heal our land. This is our prayer for our city, our community, our nation, and our land.

Today, we pray for wisdom, protection, and revival—believing that our city will flourish as God's purposes are fulfilled.

#### Prayer

*Father God, I pray for my city. Bless its leaders, protect its people, and bring peace within its borders. Let righteousness, justice, and compassion rise up. May this city be known for Your goodness and grace. In Jesus' name, amen.*

# Day Seventeen

## PRAYING FOR COMMUNITY

---

### Day 17: Pray for America

Scripture calls us to pray for our nation, especially in times of division and uncertainty. Today, we pray for humility, healing, and spiritual renewal across America. We believe God is still at work, drawing hearts back to truth and restoring what has been broken.

#### **Prayer**

*God, we lift up America to You. Heal division, restore unity, and turn hearts back to You. Give wisdom to leaders, peace to communities, and hope to those who feel weary. Let Your truth guide this nation. In Jesus' name, amen.*

# Day Eighteen

## PRAYING FOR COMMUNITY

---

### Day 18: Pray for Government Leaders and Officials

Leadership carries great responsibility. God calls us to pray for those in authority, asking that they lead with wisdom, integrity, and justice. Today, we pray not with criticism, but with faith—trusting God to guide those who make decisions that affect many.

One of the most important responsibilities we have is to pray for our government leaders. From a Biblical perspective, leaders are those who are in positions of authority over us. We all have several leaders that we submit to on a daily basis, including government officials such as mayors, governors, police officers, court judges, members of Congress, and the President.

It also includes employers, supervisors, school principals, teachers, coaches and business managers/administrators. God is the ultimate authority, so we pray for God's will to be done in the lives of our leaders. Pray for wisdom and guidance in every decision and pray for protection for them and their families. Thank you Lord for Godly authority to govern us.

#### **Prayer**

*Lord, I pray for government leaders and officials at every level. Grant them wisdom, discernment, and humility. Surround them with godly counsel and lead them to make decisions that honor You and serve people well. In Jesus' name, amen.*

# Day Nineteen

## PRAYING FOR COMMUNITY

---

### Day 19: Pray for First Responders and Our Military

Our military personnel and first responders serve on the front lines, often at great personal cost. Today, we lift up those who protect, rescue, and serve—asking God to cover them with strength, peace, and protection as they care for others. God sees their service, their courage, and the unseen burdens they bear. Today, we intentionally lift them up in prayer, believing God for protection, strength, and peace.

As we pray, we ask God to guard their minds, bodies, and hearts. We pray for supernatural protection over them and we believe for wisdom in split-second decisions, calm in chaotic moments, and rest for weary souls. Let our prayers cover not only military and first responders, but also their families—trusting that God is near, present, and faithful in every call they answer.

#### **Prayer**

*Father, I pray for first responders—police officers, firefighters, medical workers, and emergency personnel. Protect them as they serve, strengthen them in body and spirit, and give them peace in difficult moments. Bless their families and guard their hearts. In Jesus' name, amen.*

# Day Twenty

## PRAYING FOR COMMUNITY

---

### Day 20: Pray for Israel and the Nations of the World

God's Word calls us to pray for the peace of Jerusalem. Psalm 122:6 reminds us, "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem." Today, we lift up Israel, praying for peace, protection, and salvation. We trust God's purposes and timing, believing He is faithful to His promises.

God's heart has always been for the nations. From the beginning, His desire has been that every tribe, tongue, and people would know His love and salvation. Today, we broaden our prayers beyond our own borders and believe God for global transformation. We pray that everyone would have the opportunity to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

As we pray for the nations, we ask for peace where there is war, provision where there is lack, and light where there is darkness. We believe for revival, justice, and the advancement of the Gospel. This final day reminds us that our prayers reach farther than we can see, and that God is moving across the earth.

#### **Prayer**

*Lord, we pray for Israel. Bring peace within its borders and protection over its people. Let Your purposes be fulfilled and Your name be glorified. We ask for healing, wisdom, and salvation. In Jesus' name, amen.*
